Shock road safety show for teenagers

On the 12th of October Year 12 students attended a "Road Safety Road Show" in Omagh Leisure Centre. The Importance of road safety was brought home in vivid detail to Omagh area youth through the award winning Roadsafe Roadshow.

It had been devised by the PSNI with the support of Omagh District Policing partnership (DPP) and AXA Insurance. The Roadshow depicted graphically how a night out can end in tragedy and permanent disability. The story was told by a police officer, a paramedic, a fire officer, an Accident and Emergency consultant, a representative of a victim support group and Gareth Cahoon, from the Portadown area, who was paralysed following a horrific collision.

The event educated young drivers, making them aware of the potential impact that a crash will have on themselves and their loved ones, and ultimately have a positive impact on their future driving behaviour.


LINEN DAY AT THE
