Together Through Culture (TTC) was developed by Comhairle na Gaelscolaíochta (The Council for Irish-medium Education), and seeks to increase knowledge, understanding and awareness of Gaelic, illustrating its relevance to all who inhabit the island of Ireland, through references to place-names, surnames, music and through imparting some basic words and phrases in Gaelic. 




Company Name - "Craddocks":
