

About the Award

The Award was created to commemorate the late Pope John Paul II who was so committed to young people and who had such belief and confidence in them.

Through the Pope John Paul II Award, young people will be enabled to take an active part in the life of their Church, in the life of their community and society and also become more aware of the teaching and role of the Catholic Church in the world. This will enable young people to engage at a deep level with Christ, whose body the Church is.

It will allow young people to understand that religion and faith are not just for learning, nor are they a list of rules, but that they are for living.

Who is the Award for?

- Students in Year 13
- Students in full-time education who have completed GCSEs
- Anyone between the age of 16 and 18, not in post-primary education The award is non-competitive, flexible and voluntary and requires an ongoing commitment.



How many Awards are there?

There are four Awards: The Papal Cross, Gold, Silver and Bronze.
