St. John's travelled to Mid-Ulster Sports Arena (MUSA) in Cookstown to participate in a group blitz to earn a place in the quarter-finals of this year's Ulster Schools competition. There were seven teams in this group and the top two teams go through to the quarter-finals after Halloween. The teams taking part in this blitz with us were, St. Catherine's Armagh, Sperrin Integrated, St. Mary's Irvinestown, Gaelcholaiste Dhoire, St. John the Baptist Portadown and Drumragh Integrated.
