Year 8 students visit An Creagán

8A2 went on an educational visit to An Creagán on Monday the 13th of November 2017 for a Peatland Ecosystem study targeting Key Stage 3 which involved an introduction to bogs, their formation, plant and animal species that live there and a taster of some of the sampling techniques used to study a habitat along with Year 8 pupils from Castlederg High School.

As part of the day we went on a Bog Walk where Peter Brown or Niamh walked us along the bog edge and into the forest plantation with stops to look at key features and species. The pupils got to experience Pond Dipping, using nets to sample inverts and amphibians after an introduction to methods of sampling a habitat. Our afternoon saw us turf cutting using a turf spade to cut several pieces of turf concluding with a melting of marshmallows over a turf fire in a mud thatched round hut and mud floor. A great day was had by all, with brilliant hands-on experiences. A day to remember.
