UNDER-14 BOYS WIN ULSTER TITLE

St John's Dromore played in the Ulster schools Corn mac Nesa Under 14 ½ cup final in MUSA, Cookstown, on Friday 17th January.

They fought their way to the final through a tough program of games, defeating teams such as Drumragh Integrated, St Mary's, Irvinestown and St John the Baptist Portadown in the early stages of the competition.

In the Quarter-final they faced a strong Sperrin Integrated from Magherafelt and came out comfortable winners by 4-15 to 1-5. Callum Welsh had an excellent game that day scoring 2-6, while Christy Mc Gurren was solid at centre-half back.

In the semi-final on the 17th December they met St Brigid's of Derry, winning by a scoreline of 8-15 to 4-2. The main scorers that day were Paschal Donnelly 3-7, Callum Welsh 3-7 and Callum Hunter with 2-0. Marcus Kelly had an excellent performance in defence that day.

In the final they met a very strong All Saints team from Belfast who fought hard in the first half, but as the game wore on St John's skill and determination flourished. We had strong performances from a number of players, notably Christy McGurren, Eoghan McCann and Calum Welsh, with Nathan Hunter getting through a lot of work around the midfield. In the end St John's were victorious by a scoreline of 4-12 to 3-4. Scorers on the day: J Moore 1-0, Paschal Donnelly 1-3, Colm McCann 1-0, Calum Welsh 0-8, Nathan Hunter 1-1.
