Congratulations to our Year 10 students Chloe McWilliams, Liam Dillon, Alex Boyle, Leah McBride & Edel McWilliams.

Pupils in Year 10 developed a futuristic vehicle as part of the "Imagine the Future" schools' competition. Innovation 2021 is an initiative from the Department of Education and Young Enterprise NI to challenge students to shape Northern Ireland's next 100

St. John's College was placed in the top four schools in N. Ireland and the Design & Technology Department was awarded £3,000 to go towards introducing new technologies to the department. The team included Liam Dillon, Edel McWilliams, Chloe McWilliams, Leah McBride and Alex Boyle. They designed and developed a futuristic vehicle which could travel on water and use the ocean's rubbish to power itself. Their idea will be displayed in the Museum of Innovation at the Ulster Transport Museum. The Year 10 students also received an all-expenses paid visit to the Museum of Innovation to be organised later this year.

The programme inspired creative thinking in the pupils. It allowed pupils to develop critical skills such as design, research and being able to "think outside the box". Many brilliant, imaginative ideas were put forward. Congratulations to all involved.

Year 9 watched **Harriet**, a 2019 film that tells the true story of Harriet Tubman, a black woman born into slavery in 1840's America. She goes on to escape slavery and personally free more than 70 slaves and lead 150 black soldiers in the American Civil War, freeing over 750 slaves.

Year 8 watched **Miss Potter**, which tells the story of English writer, illustrator, natural scientist and conservationist, Beatrix Potter. She is also credited with preserving much of the land that now constitutes the Lake District National Park.










### FOREST SCHOOL WIN FOR THE SCHOOL

St John's College won a Forest School Award's programme through Fermanagh and Omagh District Council. A Forest School is based on a Scandinavian idea that considers children's contact with nature to be extremely important. Brian Poots from Clandeboye Estate came to our school and trained a teacher over two days on how to deliver the programme. Out in the school grounds, Year 8 students had to work in teams to construct maps of the town using the natural materials that lay around them e.g. leaves, twigs. They also built dens using bamboo and tarpaulins. They then used natural materials to construct 3D shapes and calculate the height and age of the trees using only wool and sticks.

#### OUR PATH TO THE FINAL

In the 1st round blitz which was played at MUSA in Cookstown St John's won all their games defeating St Mary's Irvinestown, St John the Baptist Portadown and Drumragh Integrated. This saw them qualify for the Ulster Quarter Final where they played Sperrin Integrated from Magherafelt. After a great all-round team performance St John's had a comfortable victory on a scoreline of 6-13 to 3-10. Team Captain Callum Welsh was the standout performer on the day and finished with a personal tally of 3-8 to his name. Others to shine were Calum Hunter who scored 1-4, Fabian Healy scoring 1-1. Donal Mc Quaid 0-2 and Ryan Campbell 0-2 had a great game in the half-forward line while Nathan Hunter gave a commanding performance in midfield and Edward Liggett was the star performer in the defence.

The Semi-Final which took place at Clann Na nGael's pitch in Dunamanagh was played on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> March against Our Lady of Lourdes College Ballymoney. This was a tight affair with Ballymoney starting very well but the St John's boys hit a purple patch just before half time with Callum Welsh and Nathan Hunter hitting 1-2 apiece to restore the lead and go into the break 3-6 to 3-1 ahead. The second half saw an overall improved performance from St John's and with Eoghan McCann moved to full forward he hit a personal tally of 1-3 to help St John's to victory on a final score-line of 5-13 to 3-10. The contribution of team captain Callum Welsh finishing with 2-2 to his name and Nathan Hunter who gave an excellent display dominating midfield was pivotal to the outcome. There were also strong performances from Edward Liggett and Marcus Kelly who both kept the defence well marshalled at the back throughout. We can now look forward with confidence to the final on the 27<sup>th</sup> April.
