St John's Win Pollinator Garden Grant

In June, Julie Corry, the Biodiversity Officer at Fermanagh and Omagh District Council, visited our school to congratulate us on recently winning a $\pounds 12,000$ School Pollinator Garden Grant. Mrs Clare-Louise Doyle, Year 10 Classroom Assistant, Mrs Clare-Kelly, Senior Management and Miss Beattie, Art teacher, have been working hard, behind the scenes, planning a new outdoor garden experience for the staff and pupils of the school.

The Live Here Love Here School Pollinator Garden grants are being wholly provided by the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs. They are being promoted through the Live Here Love Here collaborative partnership, involving DAERA, ten Local Councils, Northern Ireland Housing Executive and Keep Northern Ireland Beautiful.

St John's College said, 'It is our aim to use the Pollinator Garden Grant to create a Legacy Garden that involve both staff, pupils and the wider community. We are all very much aware of the climate crisis and what that means for our planet. Pollinators have suffered greatly from loss of habitat. Our pollinating garden will be our response to this biodiversity crisis.'

'We want to create a new outdoor classroom that will give us opportunities to enhance learning with hands-on practical activities. We want to install a polytunnel so that more varieties of flowers and vegetables can be grown and allow learning to take place all year round. We want all pupils to be able to enjoy and experience our new garden space by installing outdoor covered, recreational seated areas. There





is still a lot of hard work ahead but the teachers and pupils are so pleased and thankful to be awarded this grant.'

Camphill Community Visit

On 3rd May, 2022 10A1 visited Camphill Community in Clanabogan. We met Una Brogan, the head gardener who spoke to the group about the community. Camphill comprises of a large organic garden with polytunnels and a farm set in 40 acres. It provides care services for 70 people with learning disabilities and other support needs. Here the residents avail of a wide range of workshops and day activities such as gardening, farming and weaving. Clanbogan is also about ecology and sustainability. It respects the natural world around us and takes steps to minimise environmental impact through, biodynamic agriculture, fairtrade practices and energy -saving activities. 10A1 got a lot of inspiration which they were able to take back and incorporate into our own school garden.
