

During COP 22, parties encourage actions to implement the agreement that will address climate change. During this week, KS3 pupils did their bit to address Climate change. Year 9 cleared up around the school grounds by gathering up the fallen leaves and leaving them in the hedgerows. Wildlife ranging from turtles and toads to birds, mammals and invertebrates rely on leaf litter for food, shelter, and nesting material. Many moth and butterfly caterpillars overwinter in fallen leaves before emerging in spring. Year 8, 9 and 10 also participated in a litterpick around the school grounds and the Dromore Riverside Walk.


















#### **Extended Schools Programme Classes**

### Polytunnel Arrives at St John's


