As part of the South West College 'Sustainable Future's Initiative', Year 8 were invited to attend two workshops in the college in Omagh. The first of these were **Plants**, **Pollinators and Biodiversity**. Supriya Foster, Sustainability Officer with SWC, delivered an interactive and informative workshop where pupils learned how insects search for food through colour and scent. They learned about providing habitats that are rich in food for our pollinators through planting more native flowers and trees.



The second workshop was **Renewables and Water Conservation**.
